Call to Order/ Introductions: Chair Williams called the meeting to order at 1:01 PM and welcomed all present. Introductions were conducted, followed by the Introduction of online viewers.

Action Items:

- **I. Approval of Consent Agenda:** Chair Williams called for a motion to approve the consent agenda. Upon a motion made by Mr. Wright and a second by Mr. Schlichting, the board unanimously approved the consent agenda.
- II. Transportation Improvement Program Revisions for Approval: Ms. Ritchie informed the Board of two separate programming modifications to the Transportation Improvement Program. The first modification involves withdrawing funding for the 1st Street East & West Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvement Project in Conover due to unanticipated right-of-way and utility relocation issues. The second modification pertains to the withdrawal of funding for the Lovelady Rd. Sidewalk Phase I Project in Valdese, following a determination that the project's cost exceeded the town's budget. Upon a Motion made by Mr. Wright and seconded by Mrs. Smith, the board unanimously approved the Transportation Improvement Program Revisions.
- III. Locally Administered Projects Program New project Recommendations for Release: Mr. Odom presented the Spring 2025 project applications under the Locally Administered Project Program, which include Conover Boulevard Sidewalk and Corridor Improvements, Kenworth Sidewalk, US 70/4th Street Intersection supplemental funding, Massell Avenue Sidewalk, and Laurel Street Sidewalk. The total funding for these projects is approximately \$5.78 million, with federal funding totaling \$4.625 million and a local match of \$1.156 million. Mr. Odom also explained that there's \$2 million available for the Fall 2025 Call for Projects and \$5 million for Spring 2026, with funding sources including STBG-DA and CMAQ.

- **Division 12:** Mr. Panicker provided project updates within the agenda packet for Division 12 & Division 13.
- **Division 13:** Mrs. Smith had no new updates. She will be leaving her position and her replacement is currently being sought.
- **NCDOT-TPD:** Mr. Crummy informed the board about the upcoming NCDOT Freight Plan updates starting in June.
- **NCDOT-IMD:** No updates
- **FHWA:** No updates

Reminders: Ms. Ritchie reminded members to submit recommendations for the bike and pedestrian plan as well as the upcoming workshop for the locally coordinated plan. It was noted that the NC Bike Walk Summit will be hosted in Hickory from September 7^{th} through September 9^{th} .

CITY OF CONOVER RESOLUTION 15-25

RESOLUTION TO WITHDRAW THE 1ST STREET EAST & WEST BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENT PLAN (C-5624) FROM THE STATEWIDE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PLAN (STIP)

WHEREAS, the Greater Hickory Metropolitan Planning Organization (GHMPO) awarded the City of Conover funding for engineering and construction of bicycle and pedestrian facilities along 1st Street East (US Hwy 70-A) and 1st Street West (US Hwy 70) from I-40 to NC 16, including a lane reduction along a four-lane portion of said road, identified as project C-5624; and

WHEREAS, the City of Conover, over the course of preliminary engineering, has determined that the project will require unanticipated right of way acquisition, utility relocation and easement acquisition, raising the cost and lengthening the timeline of the project.

WHEREAS, the City of Conover is returning \$1,943,000 in CMAQ funds and \$2,123,000 in STBG-ANY funds to the GHMPO's discretionary funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Conover City Council requests that the GHMPO withdraw the 1st Street East & West Bicycle & Pedestrian Project (C-5624) from the STIP.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

The Western Piedmont Council of Governments (WPCOG) and Greater Hickory Metropolitan Planning Organization (GHMPO) receive roughly \$3.5 million annually in federal transportation grant funding for multimodal projects (pedestrian, transit, small intersection). These funds are managed through the Locally Administered Projects Program (LAPP). The GHMPO holds a yearly call for new projects and supplemental requests in early Spring of the Calendar Year. The Target investment amount for the Spring 2025 call for projects is \$4.6 million dollars in Federal STBG-DA funds.

The GHMPO received five (5) project applications for consideration. Those projects are:

- 1. Conover Boulevard Sidewalk and Corridor Improvements (City of Conover)
 - a. Total Cost: \$831,825.00
 - b. Total Score: 75
- 2. US-70/4th Street Intersection Improvements (City of Hickory)
 - a. Total Cost: \$500,000.00
 - b. Total Score: 69
- 3. Kenworth Sidewalk Additions (City of Hickory)
 - a. Total Cost: \$3,500,000.00
 - b. Total Score: 43
- 4. Massel Avenue Sidewalk (Town of Valdese)
 - a. Total Cost: \$950,000.00
 - b. Total Score: 43
- 5. Laurel Street Sidewalk (Town of Valdese)
 - a. Total Cost: \$600,000.00
 - b. Total Score: 41

Based on funding availability (\$4.6MM), and project scores, GHMPO staff are presenting a funding proposal that funds four (4) of the five (5) project applications received, with a total proposed funding value of \$4.625M in federal dollars. The selected projects are:

- 1. Conover Boulevard Sidewalk (City of Conover)
- 2. US-70/4th Street Intersection Improvements (City of Hickory)
- 3. Kenworth Sidewalk Additions (City of Hickory)
- 4. Massel Avenue Sidewalk (Town of Valdese)

Selected Projects and the Proposed Funding Scenario are available for Committee action at the June 25, 2025, MPO meeting.

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED: Staff request that the Technical Coordinating Committee and Transportation Advisory Committee approve the Locally Administered Projects/Funding Proposal, AND Staff request that the Technical Coordinating Committee and Transportation Advisory Committee approve the corresponding STIP amendments to authorize funding.






US 70/4th Street Intersection Improvements



SUBJECT: Resolutions of Support for Safe Streets for All Program, Averi Ritchie, Transportation Planning Manager

ATTACHMENTS: Resolutions of Support for Safe Streets for All Program – City of Hickory and City of Lenoir

SUMMARY OF REQUEST: The *Safe Streets for All (SS4A)* program is a discretionary grant initiative administered by the U.S. Department of Transportation as part of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. The program aims to improve roadway safety by supporting comprehensive strategies and implementation projects that prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries.

SS4A provides two types of funding:

- **Planning and Demonstration Grants**, which help local and regional entities develop Action Plans to address safety risks;
- **Implementation Grants**, which fund projects and strategies identified in qualifying safety plans to reduce crashes and improve safety for all road users, including pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists.

To be eligible for SS4A Implementation Grants, applicants must have a U.S. DOT-compliant safety action plan in place. In April 2025, the Greater Hickory MPO formally adopted the **Western Piedmont Transportation Safety Plan**, which qualifies the region for SS4A Implementation Grant funding.

For the 2025 grant cycle, two local jurisdictions within the GHMPO region have submitted SS4A Implementation Grant applications:

- **City of Hickory**: Proposing safety improvements at the high-crash intersection of Catawba Valley Boulevard and Startown Road;
- **City of Lenoir**: Seeking funding for multimodal safety upgrades along Harper Avenue, a corridor identified for its crash history and access needs.

Both projects are consistent with regional goals outlined in the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan, Comprehensive Transportation Plan, and Western Piedmont Transportation Safety Plan, and represent a strong alignment with SS4A program priorities.

City of Hickory 2025 Safe Streets for All Implementation Grant Application

WHEREAS, the City of Hickory is applying for federal funding through the U.S. Department of Transportation's 2025 Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Implementation Grant program to address critical safety needs at the intersection of Catawba Valley Boulevard and Startown Road; and

WHEREAS, this intersection serves nearby neighborhoods, Catawba Valley Community College (CVCC), and a growing number of commercial businesses, and has experienced a high frequency of crashes, including one pedestrian fatality, nine injury crashes, and numerous property damage incidents between March 1, 2020, and February 28, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hickory is actively developing a local safety plan through its 2023 SS4A Planning Grant, while the Greater Hickory Metropolitan Planning Organization (GHMPO) adopted a regional Comprehensive Safety Action Plan in April 2025, both of which identify this intersection as a priority location based on crash history and multimodal safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, the proposed safety improvements—including new sidewalks, enhanced pedestrian crossings, ADA-compliant curb ramps, pedestrian refuge islands, and upgraded signal infrastructure—are expected to reduce crashes, improve visibility, and increase safe mobility options for pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists; and

WHEREAS, the project is consistent with and supports the adopted goals and priorities of the GHMPO's 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP), and the Western Piedmont Transportation Safety Plan, particularly the objectives to improve multimodal safety, enhance pedestrian infrastructure, and reduce regional crash rates; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greater Hickory Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby expresses its strong support for the City of Hickory's 2025 SS4A Implementation Grant application and urges the U.S. Department of Transportation to give this application full and favorable consideration.

RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE CITY OF LENOIR'S 2025 SAFE STREETS FOR ALL (SS4A) IMPLEMENTATION GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the City of Lenoir is seeking federal funding through the United States Department of Transportation's Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Implementation Grant Program to fund critical safety improvements along Harper Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Harper Avenue is a key transportation corridor in Lenoir, serving multiple neighborhoods and local businesses, and has been identified as a high-priority area for safety improvements due to a history of crashes and multimodal safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Hickory Metropolitan Planning Organization (GHMPO) adopted its Comprehensive Safety Action Plan in April 2025, identifying the segment of Harper Avenue between Norwood Street and US-321 as a priority corridor based on crash risk and inclusion in the regional High Injury Network; and

WHEREAS, data-driven analysis demonstrates that this corridor has elevated risk scores for severe crash types, including lane departure, bicycle and pedestrian incidents, speed-related crashes, and intersection-related collisions; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lenoir's proposed project includes streetscape enhancements, new sidewalks, ADA-compliant curb ramps, upgraded pedestrian crossings, driveway access management, and drainage improvements—all of which are designed to reduce conflict points and enhance safety for all modes of travel; and

SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

North Carolina's **Strategic Transportation Investments** (**STI**) **Law**, enacted in 2013, established a data-driven process for selecting and funding transportation projects through a recurring process known as **Prioritization**. Administered by the **North Carolina Department of Transportation** (**NCDOT**), this process evaluates highway, bicycle/pedestrian, transit, rail, and aviation projects every two years.

The current cycle, **Prioritization 8.0 (P8.0)**, is part of the development of the **2026–2035 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)**. Under P8.0, candidate projects are scored and ranked based on quantitative data, local input, and planning consistency. Projects are evaluated within three funding tiers:


- Statewide Mobility (100% data-driven),
- Regional Impact (70% data-driven, 30% local input),
- **Division Needs** (50% data-driven, 50% local input).

The Greater Hickory MPO (GHMPO) plays a critical role in P8.0 by submitting candidate projects, assigning local input points, and ensuring that projects align with regional plans such as the **2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP)** and **Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP)**.


P8.0 emphasizes project readiness, cost-effectiveness, and alignment with statewide and regional goals. The results of this prioritization cycle will influence which transportation projects are programmed for funding in the next STIP.




MPO Planning Responsibilities



Overview of Carryover Projects

Under NCDOT's Strategic Prioritization 8.0 (P8.0) process, *Carryover Projects* are projects that were evaluated in the previous prioritization cycle and will automatically be re-evaluated in the current cycle without counting against an MPO's or RPO's submittal allotment.

These projects are carried forward into the P8.0 scoring process without requiring resubmittal and are tracked for potential inclusion in the 2026–2035 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

Definition of Carryover Projects

A project qualifies as a **Carryover** if it meets one of the following criteria:

- Included in the Current STIP but Not Scheduled for Delivery
 (Delivery defined as Right-of-Way, Construction, or Letting not yet underway)
- Environmental Documentation Completed or In Progress
 (Includes NEPA or SEPA documentation that is actively being developed or finalized)
- Sibling Project to a Programmed Project
 (Typically a segment or phase of a larger, already programmed project)
- **Any committed projects (scheduled for delivery)** that are currently included in the 2024-2033 STIP as of Jan. 1, 2025 (As of this time, there are no projects that meet this requirement.).

Important Notes

- These projects will be **automatically scored** during the P8.0 cycle.
- No local points are required for resubmittal, though local input scoring will still apply where relevant.
- MPO partners should review all carryover projects to confirm accuracy and ensure alignment with current local priorities.
