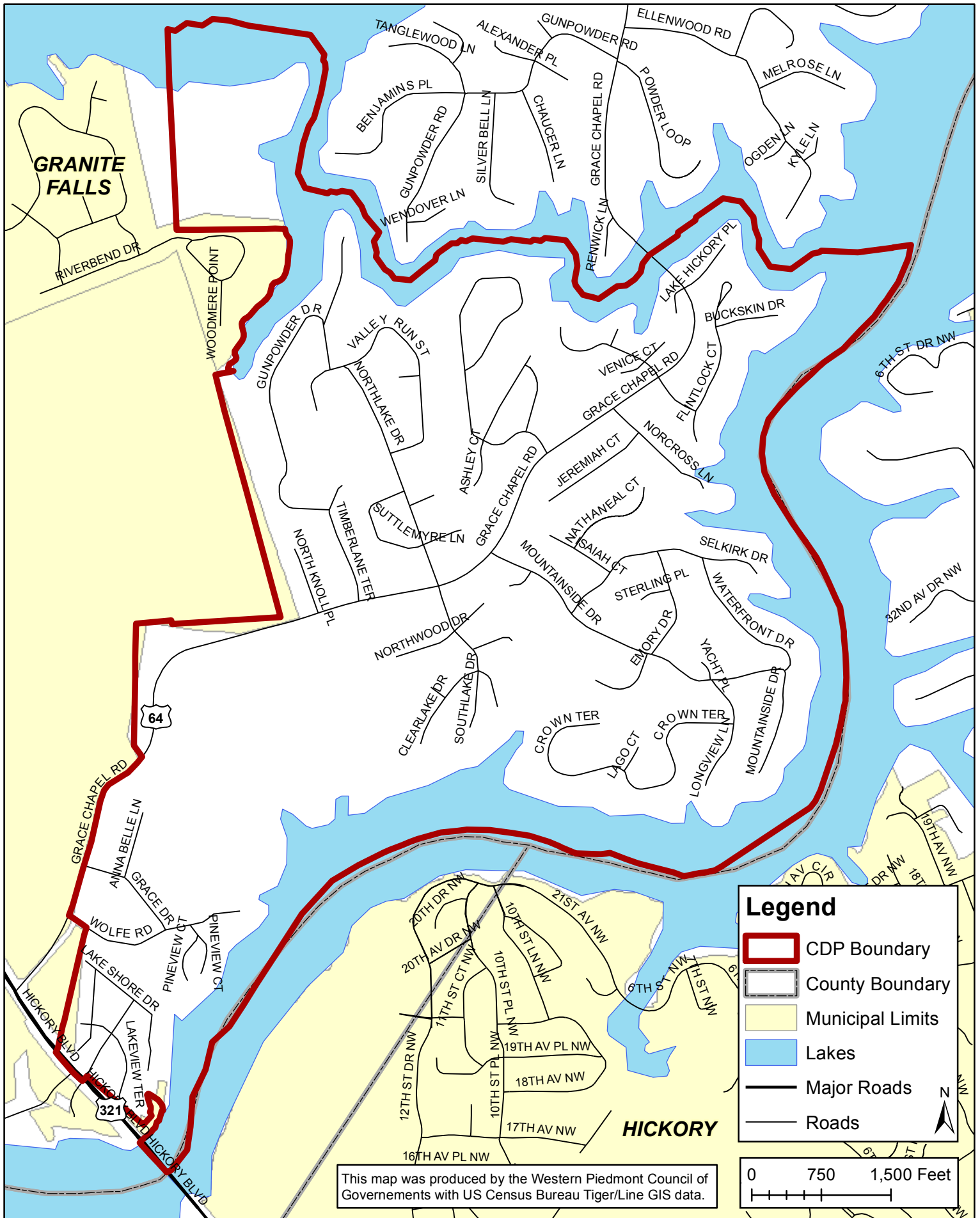


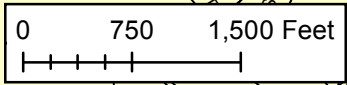
# Northlakes Census Designated Place (CDP)
