Call to Order/Ethics Awareness/ and Introductions: Vice Chair Guess called the meeting to order at 2:30 PM and welcomed all present. Introductions were conducted, followed by the Introduction of online viewers.

Approval of Remote Participation: Online attendees were Duncan Cavanaugh, Stephan Sparks, Wendy Cato, Hannah Smith, Anil Panicker and Meagan Phillips. Vice Chair Guess canvassed the committee for any objections to online participants. Upon a motion made by Mr. Simms and seconded by Mrs. Patton, online participation was approved.

Action Items: Action Items:

- **I. Approval of Consent Agenda:** Chair Williams called for a motion to approve the consent agenda. Upon a motion from Mrs. Patton and a second from Mrs. Beatty, the Committee unanimously voted to approve the consent agenda.
- **II. Transportation Improvement Program Revisions for Approval:** Ms. Ritchie presented Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) revisions for approval. The revisions included Transit projects related to 5310 funding as well as a one-year delay related to the sidewalk project on Springs Rd in Catawba County. Upon a motion by Mrs. Patton and a second by Mr. Johnson, the revisions were approved.
- **III. 2025 MPO Meeting Schedule Modification:** Ms. Ritchie presented a modification to the existing MPO Schedule. The modification was regarding a change of date for the MPO Meeting from April 16th to April 23rd, 2025. Upon a motion made by Mr. Johnson and a second by Mrs. Patton, the MPO Meeting Schedule Modifications were approved.
- IV. FY 2026 Unified Planning Work Program & Revisions: Ms. Ritchie presented the FY 2026 UPWP & Revisions, highlighting key transportation and planning initiatives. Some of the initiatives the GHMPO will focus on include assisting with STIP updates, exploring new projects for Prioritization 8.0, and continuing the evaluation of bicycle and pedestrian needs, which involves updating the GIS inventory and developing an interactive mapping tool. The GHMPO will manage the Western Piedmont Transportation Safety Plan, focusing on safety improvements while collaborating with local governments and NCDOT. Public involvement efforts will continue through outreach strategies, including public meetings and virtual options for impacted communities. Upon a motion made by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mrs. Beatty, the FY 2026 UPWP & Revisions were approved. Upon a motion made by Vice Chair Guess and seconded by Mrs. Patton, the resolution confirming the transportation planning process was approved.
- V. **5303 STIP Amendment:** Ms. Ritchie presented the updated 5303 STIP Amendment. This update is made annually to accurately reflect requested funds for planning assistance. Upon a motion made by Mrs. Beatty and seconded by Mrs. Patton, the 5303 STIP Amendment was approved.
- **VI. Draft 2026-2035 STIP for Prioritized Projects:** Ms. Ritchie led the discussion regarding the 2026-2035 draft STIP, highlighting projects that have been

decommitted and delayed. These changes were visually presented on a map, showing the differences from the previous STIP. Further discussion took place between members and DOT, with Mr. Andrews inquiring about taxation. Mr. Lail and Mr. Stafford both provided insight regarding the Highway Funds and fuel taxes. The conversation provided valuable insights into how the adjustments would impact project timelines and resource allocation moving forward.

VII. Western Piedmont Transportation Safety Plan: Mr. Powell from VHB presented an overview of the Western Piedmont Transportation Safety Plan (WPTSP), outlining key processes and strategic goals. These include a data-driven approach, utilizing the Safe Systems Approach, and engaging underserved populations in outreach efforts. The plan focuses on reducing fatalities and serious injuries on the region's transportation system, with options for setting safety targets aligned with the State or a more aggressive timeline. Additionally, the discussion emphasized the importance of integrating safety data into planning efforts, using tools like risk analysis and project scoping to prioritize safety improvements across urban and rural areas.

NCDOT Update -

- **NC DOT Board:** Mr. Lail provided further clarification regarding highway funds, stating that the fuel tax for North Carolina is .40 cents per gallon, federal tax is .18 cents per gallon and last year \$3+ Billion was collected through these taxes. Mr. Lail also provided further clarification regarding a Highway 321 project that is about to start, the project had delays due to a switch in funding sources.
- **Division 11:** Mr. Poe presented updates on several ongoing projects, including Pinewood Road in Granite Falls, where remobilization for underground utility work is underway, and Brown Mountain Beach Road, which is improving curve areas with a contract let in January, though resurfacing won't begin until late summer due to delays from Hurricane Helene recovery efforts. Additionally, the Helene Recovery Effort is 60% complete with site-specific work and 70% of debris cleanup finished.
- **Division 12:** Mr. Stafford provided project updates within the agenda packet for Division 12 & Division 13. Mr. Stafford also provided updates about the draft STIP process, resurfacing programs that should start in mid-march and discussed road markings with Mrs. Beatty.
- **Division 13:** Mrs. Smith provided updates regarding new formats for presenting project development as well as new comparisons reports for STIP data.
- **NCDOT-TPD:** Mr. Crummy addressed two bridge replacement projects as well as traffic forecast in Burke County.
- **NCDOT-IMD:** No updates
- **FHWA:** No updates

Reminders: Ms. Ritchie reminded members of several important items, including the need to file ethics forms, the upcoming elections for Chairman and Vice Chair, which will take place in March, and the New Member Orientation scheduled for March. She also noted that the virtual Bike/Ped and LCP surveys are now live and encouraged members to distribute them widely.
Public Comment/Announcements: None
Adjournment: Chair Guess adjourned the meeting at 3:47 p.m. The next meeting will be Wednesday, March 26 th , 2025.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

Per the attached Bylaws, a TAC Chair and Vice-Chair must be elected every two years. These officers may serve consecutive two-year terms.

The current Chair of TAC is Bruce Eckard, Council Member of City of Conover.

The current Vice-Chair of TAC is Hank Guess, Mayor of City of Hickory.

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED: TAC members must appoint or re-appoint the Chair and Vice-Chair.

Suggested Motion: I move that the TAC appoint or re-appoint NAME as Chair / Vice-Chair.

ARTICLE IV – OFFICERS

Section 1 – Officers Defined:

The officers of the MPO shall consist of a Chair and Vice-Chair.

Section 2 - Elections:

The Chair and Vice-Chair shall be elected and can remain in office until a successor has been duly elected or until his/her earlier death, resignation, disqualification, incapacity to serve, or removal in accordance with the law. The newly elected Chair and Vice-Chair shall take office immediately following the election. The Chair must have served as an MPO member (delegate or alternate) for one year immediately prior.

Additional elections may be held if either the Chair or Vice-Chair cannot carryout his/her duties and complete the remainder of the appointed term.

Section 3 - Terms of Office:

The term of office for officers shall be two years. Elections shall be held every two years and officers may serve consecutive two-year terms.

Section 4 – Duties of Officers:

The Chair shall call and preside at meetings, sub committees and set the order of business for each meeting. In the Chair's absence, the Vice-Chair shall preside and complete all other duties of the Chair. In the event that the Chair is unable to carryout his/her duties for the remainder of their term, the Vice-Chair shall carryout the functions of the Chair until a new election is held.

Section 5 – Duties of the Secretary:

Western Piedmont Council of Government's Transportation Manager will serve as Secretary and shall provide or otherwise delegate staff service for the MPO, as needed, and will be responsible for taking summary minutes of the Committee's proceedings. The Secretary will maintain a current copy of these Bylaws as an addendum to the Memorandum of Understanding, to be distributed to the public upon request.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

Section 1 – Regular Meetings:

Meetings will be held on the fourth Wednesday of evenly numbered months. The Chair may cancel regular meetings should there be insufficient business on the Committee's tentative agenda.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

The Western Piedmont Council of Governments (WPCOG) and Greater Hickory Metropolitan Planning Organization (GHMPO) receive roughly \$3.5 million annually in federal transportation grant funding for multimodal projects (pedestrian, transit, small intersection). These funds are managed through the Locally Administered Projects Program (LAPP). The GHMPO holds a yearly call for new projects and supplemental requests in early Spring of the Calendar Year. The Target investment amount for the Spring 2025 call for projects is \$4.6 million dollars in Federal STBG-DA funds.

The GHMPO is also releasing updates to the LAPP Program Selection Methodology for Public Comment. Updates include the removal of the Transportation Disadvantaged Index and select project type language. Requested removals are an effort to ensure compliance and consistency with updated federal funding initiatives.

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Locally Administered Project Program: Spring 2025 Call for New Projects & Supplemental Requests

GHMPO TCC and TAC March 26, 2024

Funding Overview

- As a designated Transportation Management Area, the MPO receives directing authority for \$3.5M in federal transportation funding.
- Projects compete through the approved application and scoring methodology of the Locally Administered Project Program.
- Typical Projects include sidewalk extensions, small intersection improvements, multi-use path construction.
- Federal Funding Available: \$4.6M -- Surface Transportation Block Grant



Eligibility Checklist

Eligible Uses:

- o Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements
- o Small Roadway/Intersection Projects
- o Transit Improvements

o Eligibility Requirements:

- o Project Area must be identified on the Federal Aid System
- o Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects must serve a transportation purpose
- o Safety projects may be eligible on any roadway if they meet federal safety project requirements.
- o Must be locally administered.



Application Timeline

- March 26, 2025 Call for Projects Opens
- May 2, 2025 Project Applications and Local Support Resolutions Due
- May 28, 2025 Project Applications and Tentative Funding Proposal Released for Public Comment
- June 25, 2025 Project Applications and Final Funding Proposal Available for Approval by GHMPO Board.
- August/September, 2025 BOT Approval of Project Funding
- While not required, pre-submittal meetings are highly encouraged. Let's talk!



Methodology Update

- While the MPO holds selection authority at the regional level, LAPP funding is federally allocated and authorized.
- To ensure compliance with E.O. 14148 and E.O. 14151 MPO staff are requesting that TCC and TAC consider the removal of the Transportation Disadvantage Index from the LAP methodology, and removal of "Cycle-Tracks" and other Bicycle-centric transportation language.
- This proposed update is being released for public comment and will be available for action at the April TCC/TAC meeting.

USDOT Issues Final Rule Establishing Accessibility Standards for Transit Stops in the Public Right-of-Way

The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) issued a final rule establishing clear, uniform standards for designing accessible pedestrian facilities at transit stops in the public right-of-way. Effective January 17, 2025, the rule adopts the U.S. Access Board Accessibility Guidelines for Pedestrian Facilities in the Public Right-of-Way (PROWAG) as USDOT's regulatory standards for new construction and alterations. This rule simplifies compliance for State and local agencies by removing the need for independent evaluations of accessibility guidance. It also promotes consistency across projects, improving accessibility for all transit users and supporting USDOT broader efforts for multimodal transportation access.

Updated Pedestrian and Bicycle Funding Opportunities Table (FHWA)

Provides an updated overview of Federal funding programs for pedestrian, bicycle, and micromobility projects. Outlines eligible activities and projects, helping sponsors integrate safety into initiatives.
