Call to Order and Introductions – TCC Chair Randy Williams called the meeting to order and welcomed all present at 1:05 PM. Introductions were made around the room, followed by those participating remotely, which included TCC members Blake Wright, Greg Wilson, Jenny Wheelock, John Marshall, Sherri Bradshaw, and Steve Miller. The TCC unanimously consented to the remote participation of the aforementioned members.

Action Items:

- I. Approval of Minutes Chair Williams asked members if they had a chance to review the minutes. Upon a motion from Mr. Prisby and a second by Mr. Eubanks, the TCC unanimously approved the minutes from their October 27, 2021, meeting.
- II. Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) Revision for Approval Mr. Horton presented the staff recommendation to approve the TIP Revision in Attachment II. Mr. Horton noted no comments had been received, since the TIP Revision was released for public comment on October 27, 2021. Upon a motion from Mr. Prisby and a second by Mr. Eubanks, the TCC unanimously recommended Item II to TAC for approval.

- III. Revised Safety Targets for 2022 Mr. Horton presented the recommended safety targets in Attachment III. Upon a motion from Mr. Prisby and a second by Mr. Eubanks, the TCC unanimously recommended Item III to TAC for approval.
- IV. Re-Scoping Concepts for Area Projects Mr. Horton shared the latest cost estimates for committed projects in the current (2020-2029) STIP. The latest cost estimates exceed available funding by \$11 billion. Mr. Horton then presented high-level conceptual design changes to projects that may potentially reduce costs. Examples included replacing outer 4-lane sections with 3-lane sections and phasing segments of projects. Chair Williams confirmed that projects mapped green were safe but could be delayed, while projects mapped yellow were at risk for not making into the next (2024-2033) STIP. Mr. Eubanks commented how ROW acquisition was a huge cost and suggested revisiting some super-street recommendations to save on cost. Mr. Sparks commented how crash types drove design decisions. Mr. Eubanks asked if NCDOT could re-evaluate multiple options in a given time period. Mr. Horton replied that local government input would help narrow options to be explored. Mr. Wilson confirmed that the Dudley Shoals Rd on-ramp to 321 may be a lower priority, given committed Pinewood Rd intersection improvements. No action was required for this information item.

- **Division 13** Mr. Guffey presented an update, including the final overlay for Exit 112.


Process for 2024-2033 STIP Development

Step 2 -Held Harmless projects remain in STIP




GHMPO Maps = Red -Step 1, Green -Step 2, Yellow - Step 3







NCDOT Yearly Litter Collection

The NCDOT crews, contractors and volunteers have collected more than 12 million pounds of litter from roadsides, further solidifying this year as a record-setting one. NCDOT's litter management programs are multifaceted. The department makes use of state-owned forces and contract services statewide. NCDOT's Sponsor-A-Highway Program allows businesses, organizations and individuals to sponsor litter removal along roadsides. NCDOT is also proud to partner with the more than 120,000 participants in the Adopt-A-Highway Program, where volunteers pledge to clean a section of our highways at least four times a year.

Travel Delay on I-40 in Mountains

In case you plan to travel west this winter, there are potential delays on I -40 in the Pigeon River Gorge due to the replacement of a bridge on I-40 over Harmon Den Road and Cold Springs Creek. Delays are expected in both directions for the next six months. NCDOT and the Tennessee Department of Transportation recommend that drivers plan ahead, prepare for delays and consider an alternate route through Kingsport, Tenn. FHWA News

The FHWA invites comment on the development of guidance for two new electric vehicle charging station programs included in the recently enacted Bipartisan Infrastructure It established the National Electric Vehicle Formula Program to strategically deploy an interconnected network of EV charging stations along highway corridors, by providing states with formula funding. The Charging and Fueling Infrastructure discretionary grant program will make competitive grants available to improve public accessibility to electrical vehicle charging and hydrogen, propane and natural gas fueling stations, along designated alternative fuel corridors or other community locations accessible to drivers. FHWA Innovation of the Month Project

Unexpected slowdowns on roadways with truck traffic pose a danger for all road users. The NCDOT designated approximately 460 rural miles of I-95 and I-40 in a unique project that leverages real time, crowdsourced traffic data from INRIX to identify speed differentials. Once identified, information is shared via Drivewyze to truck drivers operating in a defined area near the slowdown event. The Drivewyze warning system enables truck drivers using the service to prepare appropriately when entering potentially harmful traffic conditions, particularly the formation of dangerous queues related to non-recurring events like roadway incidents, work zones, and adverse weather. During September 2021, more than 2,500 alerts were received by Drivewyze users on NC interstates, via their in-cab notification device. The NCDOT is encouraged by the effectiveness of the alerts and the potential to improve safety where dangerous slowdowns occur.
